

- Improve working conditions: Improve safety and family-friendliness at sea and ashore through binding standards.
- Strengthen diversity: Reduce discrimination and create a modern image for the industry through visible role models and active measures.
- Pool knowledge: Identify best practices through Europe-wide cooperation and establish them across the industry.
- Ensure participation: Actively involve women in the design of all support measures and programs.
